Appendix A – Glossary of Terms:

- **5 Ls of Learning:** A whole school approach to learning and teaching focused on learner centered learning, learning partnerships, literacies for the world, learning practice and learning experience, environment and engagement.
- Authentic Learning and/or Assessment: Experiences that replicate the real world and enable each individual to be their true version of self. These experiences are based on choice, flexibility, learner interest, inquiry, exploration, creativity, collaboration, problem solving and celebration.
- **Contemporary Curriculum:** A learning program that:
 - Is centered on the principles of authentic learning and twenty first century pedagogy.
 - Caters for the needs, interests and mixed abilities of the twenty first century learner.
 - Reflects the desired standards established for a particular level/s.
- **Contemporary Learning Experiences:** Experiences that enable learners to acquire and demonstrate knowledge and skill in real life contexts. These experiences are based on choice, flexibility, learner interest, inquiry, exploration, creativity, collaboration, problem solving and celebration.
- **Digital Environments:** Learning environments that are digitally rich and aim to integrate technology into learning in a way that is safe and meaningful. These environments use technology as a source to redefine tasks, extending the parameters of the individual's learning experience.
- **Digital Technology:** Tools used to support the learning. These tools are used to extend the parameters of learning and redefine tasks, exposing individuals to new learning experiences that aim to build twenty first century learning skills.
- Learning Design: The planning for and creation of learning experiences.
- Learning Environments: The physical, social, cultural, digital and intellectual context and/or space in which learning occurs.
- Learning Narrative: The story and/or profile that exists about the learning of each individual.
- **Transparent Communication:** Honest, open and consistent communication about learning that establishes strong learning relationships built on mutual trust and understanding. This occurs between students, between staff, the student and teacher, students and families, families and the teacher, and the teacher and student with the community.
- **Meaningful learning:** The acquisition of knowledge and/or skill in a way that personally connects to an individual, adding value to their learning experience.
- **Multiple Intelligences:** The idea that learners possess different kinds of minds and therefore learn, remember, perform and understand in different ways.
- **Pedagogy:** The art, theory and practice of teaching and education.
- Learner Centered Learning/Learning Environments: Learning and/or environments in which the individual is the focus. Individuals are leaders of learning who are active and involved.
- **Thinking Skills:** The mental processes used to solve problems, make decisions, ask questions, make plans, pass judgments, organise information and create new ideas.
- **Twenty First Century Pedagogy:** The art of teaching that focuses on (is not limited to) literacy and numeracy, differentiation, inquiry learning, project based learning, multiple intelligences, thinking skills and authentic assessment.
- **Twenty First Century Learning Skills:** Literacy and numeracy, critical thinking and problem solving, collaboration across networks and leading by influence, agility and adaptability, initiative and entrepreneurialism, effective oral and written communication, accessing and analysing information, curiosity and imagination, creativity, digital literacy, self regulation, and resilience.
