Quick Reference Guide

The information below contains everything you need to know about enrolling in the Performing Arts Program at Kolbe Catholic College

1. Before completing the application process please read through the entire contents of this document making sure that you fully understand both a) the commitment required of your child and b) terms and conditions of enrolment.
2. Take time to have a conversation with your child as to the instrument or program they like to be involved.
3. Make the decision on the type of lesson you want for your child. Individual tuition can occur on a “**rotational**” or “**fixed**” basis. **Rotational** lessons occur during school hours whereby students are withdrawn from their timetabled class for a 25-minute lesson. Each week, students receive a different lesson time to ensure they do not miss the same lesson every week. Those students undertaking **Fixed** lessons, will be allocated a time either before school, at lunchtime or after school.

Applications received closer to the end of the term will be deferred until the start of the next term, at which point tuition will begin, unless a tutor is available sooner.

PLEASE NOTE: Enrolment in Performing Arts Tuition will continue until such time as a Cancellation of Enrolment form is received. This also applies to end of each year.

Section A: Performing Arts Tuition

Performing Arts Tutors

Performing Arts tuition is provided by qualified and experienced teachers from within the school or by external professionals who offer weekly lessons. Our tutors are talented artists committed to giving each student the individual attention and care needed for their continuous development as artists and musicians. Many of our tutors maintain successful careers outside of school as professional performers and musicians and are well respected in the wider community.

Performing Arts Available for Tuition

Kolbe Catholic College has a large variety of programs available for tuition in dance, acting, voice, piano, guitar (acoustic or electric), bass guitar, drums and trumpet.

Private Lessons

Enrolment in private Performing Arts tuition is accepted on a **yearly** basis and fees are payable in full at the commencement of each term for eight weeks' tuition. *See page 10 for fee cost details.*

Beginner and intermediate students are withdrawn from class for half a period (25 minutes) once a week during the school term. Fixed and extended lesson times are offered where possible for senior/advanced students, especially those studying VCE/VET music. In Years 7-11 the lessons rotate within the academic timetable, while at Year 12 the lessons are timetabled to fit into the students' free periods where possible.

Students are taught performance, theory, ear training and sight-reading skills using standard curriculum and textbooks. Tutors will supply supplemental material of a variety of styles based on students' interest. From time to time, tutors may request that students purchase sheet music that is relevant to their course of study. This can usually be done online or at a local music store.

Lesson Attendance

Students are expected to attend every lesson punctually and be fully prepared. Where students are absent due to illness, please give as much advance notice as possible by emailing the Director of Performing Arts and copying in the tutor. This will allow the tutor to better use any resulting vacant periods for other students. Please do this in addition to ringing the College.

Lessons missed with sufficient advance notice will be made up, as will lessons missed due to school activities. Students are expected to provide the Director of Performing Arts with at least two weeks' notice of any planned absence. Make-up lessons will take place either after all eight scheduled lessons for the term have been completed or if there is availability with the tutor during the term. Regular absences with minimal notice by a student for their scheduled lesson will not be eligible for make-up lessons unless under extreme circumstances. Parents will be notified when their child misses a lesson.

Tutors are not expected to make up lessons that students miss through family holidays during school terms.

From time to time, school tests may clash with a music lesson. Students are still required to attend their scheduled music lesson, negotiating a rescheduling of the test with the class teacher. *Make up lessons will not be given if students do not attend.* Year 12 students doing a SAC are exempt from this, however, they need to notify the Director of Performing Arts and tutor of the time and date of the SAC (at least 2 weeks in advance). *If no notification is given, no make-up lesson will be scheduled.*

When a Performing Arts lesson is scheduled midway through an academic lesson, as a matter of courtesy, the student should alert their teacher at the beginning of the lesson that they will be leaving halfway through.

Students must sign in and out of their lesson via the iPad provided at the Performing Arts building. This enables the school and teachers to know where they are, always.

Performing Arts Practice

Students are required and encouraged to practice regularly at home to enable students to get the most out of their sessions. Tutors may issue homework for students to complete. Diaries are available for students' session information to be recorded in. Contact the Director of Performing Arts if you feel this would benefit your child.

Ensemble Participation

Kolbe Catholic College offers an ensemble program to meet the needs of every student's musical ability.

Creating music with others is an exciting experience and performing in small or large groups is an integral part of the program. Ensemble participation offers students the opportunity to extend their skills, gain valuable team and performance experience. They also benefit from the camaraderie that such groups provide. If they wish, students may participate in more than one ensemble as it provides them with an opportunity to experience a variety of genre, teaching and musical styles.

Tutors will nominate and contact students to arrange an ensemble for students to be a part of when opportunities arise. This is decided based on student's ability and considering the balance of instruments within an ensemble. To minimise disruption to the academic program, ensemble rehearsals are held either before school, recess, at lunchtime or after school

Ensemble Attendance

Ensembles rehearse once a week and students are expected to attend every ensemble rehearsal and scheduled concert unless officially excused. Ensemble experience is as important as the weekly instrumental lesson and contributes to the musical development of each student.

Students should attend their ensemble rehearsal punctually and be fully prepared. A student must notify their ensemble conductor/director at least the day before if they cannot attend any rehearsals for any reason.

It is expected that students arrive before the set starting time to help with the setting up, to warm up their instruments/voices and to prepare for the rehearsal.

Students are expected help pack up all equipment at the end of the rehearsal.

All music is to be kept in the allocated folders. Students are not allowed to take home original music. Students needing practice copies should see their ensemble conductor/director.

Schedule of Fees

All students participating in the Performing Arts Private Tuition Program at Kolbe Catholic College are expected to pay fees, levied at the beginning of each term, to cover the tuition and instrument hire (where applicable).

Payment of Fees

Performing Arts tuition fees will be processed prior to the commencement of each term and must be paid in full at the commencement of each term. Where it is reasonable to do so, there will be a pro-rata adjustment made for late enrolments in the Performing Arts Tuition Program.

Lesson Guarantee

Students commencing tuition at the beginning of the academic year will receive a minimum 32 lessons. Those commencing later in the year can expect to receive:

Term Two - 24 lessons minimum

Term Three - 16 lessons minimum

Term Four - 8 lessons minimum

Students will be charged for lessons received in addition to this minimum quota.

Withdrawal from Lessons

We encourage students to persist with their chosen Performing Arts tuition option for at least one year. However, if a student wishes to cease lessons the school must receive in writing a completed *Cancellation of Enrolment form* which are available from the Director of Performing Arts.

Tuition shall cease at the end of each term provided the Director of Performing Arts receives a signed *Cancellation of Enrolment form* by:

- ❖ *Friday 28th March* for withdrawal at the end of *Term 1, 2025*.
- ❖ *Friday 27th June* for withdrawal at the end of *Term 2, 2025*.
- ❖ *Friday 12th September* for withdrawal at the end of *Term 3, 2025*.
- ❖ *Friday 28th November* for withdrawal at the end of *Term 4, 2025*.

Enrolment in instrumental music tuition will continue until such time as a Cancellation of Enrolment form is received. This includes at the end of the year.

Participation in Performing Arts Events

Kolbe Catholic College offers a rich calendar of concerts that showcase students of all abilities. Every student in the tuition program is invited to perform at nominated concerts and public events throughout the year. As students develop their skills, they are expected to have more opportunity for public performances.

2025 Year 7 Scholarships

Students entering Year 7 in 2025 can apply to receive one semester of free private Performing Arts tuition provided by qualified and experienced Performing Arts teachers from within the school or external professionals.

This unique offering provides up to 4 students the chance to have a semester of free lessons in one of the following disciplines:

- *Drums*
- *Guitar – Acoustic or electric*
- *Piano*
- *Trumpet*
- *Vocal*
- *Acting*
- *Dance*

Applications are invited from both experienced and new Performing Arts students. The selection process will involve an application and audition process, ensuring deserving students are given this valuable opportunity.

Section B: Musical Instruments

Purchasing Instrument

Students wishing to undertake tuition who do not currently own an instrument should hire or purchase an instrument to enable practice at home. For recommendations, please see speak to your instrumental staff.

Hire of Instruments –

(Only applicable to student who joined the instrumental program in 2023 or prior)

The following conditions apply to the hiring of instruments through Kolbe Catholic College:

1. For those who have a currently hired instrument, the hire fee will be billed to your College account at the beginning of each term. Please note, that instrument hire fees are subject to change without notice.

This payment covers reasonable wear and tear of Kolbe's instruments. Instruments hired by the school and loaned to students are not covered by the school's insurance policy, so it is highly recommended that parents register the instrument with their insurance provider.

2. Students must return an instrument hired by Kolbe Catholic College to the Music Faculty, in person, immediately after cessation of lessons or hire charges will incur.
3. Instrument hire is recommended for one year only after which students are encouraged to purchase an instrument of their own.
4. Reasonable care must be taken against the instrument being lost or stolen. The hirer is fully liable for the instrument during the hire period and loss of the instrument during this period will incur full replacement costs. We recommend that parents investigate insurance for loss or theft.
5. Any repairs necessary due to damage caused through negligence must be paid for by the hirer. On no account may the student or any person attempt repairs or adjustments to the instrument. Any repair necessary due to damage caused through the student's negligence must be paid for by the hirer. Any damage or defects to the instrument must be brought to the attention of the Music Faculty staff immediately.
6. All sundries such as strings, sticks etc. must be replaced by the hirer if necessary.
7. When at school, but not in use, the instrument must be stored in the music storeroom.
8. No person, other than the student or their tutor, may be allowed to play or handle the instrument.
9. At the end of the hire period the instrument must personally be returned to the Music Faculty in clean condition and in good working order.

Security of Musical Instruments

We advise that privately owned instruments be individually insured by the owner as the school insurance policy does not cover the personal property of students. Do not leave instruments in unsecured areas.

All instrument cases should be clearly labelled with the student's name and contact details and a record kept of the instrument's serial number.

Section C: Parental Involvement

What parents can do to help?

Parents and friends are warmly welcomed to all our concert events. Sharing in the performances your child is involved in adds immeasurably to their experiences in the Performing Arts. We aim to provide many performing opportunities for all our aspiring artists.

Supporting home practice is vital for the success of all students. Here are some hints on taking the “pain out practice”:

- Establish a regular practice routine.
- Daily and consistent practice is recommended to take full benefit of the tuition. Finding a regular window of time, such as immediately after school, or before or after dinner helps when establishing such a routine.
- Where practical, it is helpful if the student does not have to put their instrument away in its’ case between practice sessions.
- Encourage mini performances at home to family and friends.
- Where possible create an area for practice in your home and importantly, a music stand makes all the difference.

NOTE:

- *It is much better to practice daily for shorter manageable amounts of time rather than only one or two big practices each week.*
- *Students should have a music stand and stable chair, in a quiet place without other distractions such as TV, radio, mobile phone or other electronic devices.*

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Section D: Frequently Asked Questions

FAQs

Do you teach beginners?

Yes, we teach beginners as well as experienced students.

What if my child is experienced, will you make them start at the beginning?

No, with experienced students we try to pick up where their skills are already formed. In some cases, it may be necessary to rework incorrect habits that may have crept in over time or through informal learning.

Does my child need a musical instrument to take music lessons?

Ultimately, yes. Whether you choose to purchase or hire a musical instrument for your child, they do need something to practice on each day between their lessons. Before purchasing an instrument, please seek advice from your child's Music Tutor as to the brands/models look out for (and those to avoid!).

How long will it take before my child can perform something?

They will be performing 'something' the first lesson! Having said that, it takes time to be able to play music that sounds 'complete'. New music students can be playing something familiar in as little as a few months. How long it takes to achieve your goals depends on how much practice time is put in, the type of instrument chosen and what the individuals' goals are.

Can my child learn more than one instrument?

Students may learn more than one instrument or have more than one session of private tuition in the Performing Arts. Simply fill out an additional Enrolment Application Form.

Can my child learn at school and have lessons outside on the same instrument?

It is strongly recommended that students only have one tutor per instrument. Students can become confused and over worked with different teaching approaches/methods.

How competitive are your fees?

We want every family to be able to afford music lessons for their child. It is for this reason that we offer high-quality, affordable lessons. Our most popular lessons (individual, rotational lessons) are competitively priced at *\$25/ lesson*.

Can we take Performing Arts tuition every other week instead of every week?

No. It is important that the Tutor checks your child's progress every week. Attending weekly lessons will enhance the learning momentum and generate mastering a skill more quickly.

Furthermore, if you miss a lesson, it would be almost month before you saw your Tutor again.

When are Private tuition lessons scheduled?

Most students take individual, rotational lessons. These lessons occur during school hours. Students are withdrawn from their timetabled class for a 25-minute lesson. Each week, students receive a new time meaning they do not miss the same lesson every week. Those students undertaking fixed lessons, will be allocated a time either before school (*8.00am – 9.00am*), at lunchtime (*12.50pm – 1.20pm*) or after school (*3.15pm – 4.45pm*).

What instrument is right for my child?

For some there is the misbelief that the 1st instrument for learning must be piano but this is patently false. If you choose piano for your child over their objections, then it is your choice not theirs. If you let them choose the instrument to learn, then you will get a clear picture of their commitment level.

Can we start in the middle of the year?

Yes. In fact, we accept enrolments all year-round. Once your application has been received, it will be processed and added to the timetable to commence at the start of the next term or earlier if a place with a tutor becomes available.

How long should my child be practicing each day?

For beginners practice sessions should start at 15 – 20 minutes each day. Although, the more your child practices the faster they will progress. More advanced students (including VCE/VET Music students) should be practicing up to one hour per day.

I don't have any musical background or ability; can I still help my child practice?

Yes. Even if you don't have a musical background, you can ask the Music Tutor for advice on how to help your child practice. Finally, by simply monitoring that they are practicing every day, doing exercises a certain number of times, etc. your child will progress.
