Uniform



BAGS

All students must have an approved College bag. Laptop bags do not replace the College bag.

BEANIES AND SCARVES

Students are permitted to wear the College scarf and beanie (ink blue with monogram) with the Winter uniform. When indoors, scarves can be worn appropriately, but the beanie must be removed. For safety reasons, when students are undertaking physical activity or practical classes, these items must be removed. This is at the discretion of College staff.

BLAZER

The Blazer is the outermost garment. From the start of Term 2 until the Melbourne Cup long weekend, blazers and ties are compulsory to and from school and at all formal occasions including assemblies. In Term 1 and after the Melbourne Cup long weekend, blazers are optional. However, the jumper is not to be worn as the outermost garment.

CAP

The College cap is recommended to be worn when a student is outdoors for any prolonged period of time during the summer months (Term 1 and Term 4). Caps are recommended for all PE activities in Terms 1 and 4. Caps are not to be worn indoors. Graffiti or drawing on the College cap is not permitted. Any other hats are not permitted.

DRESSES OR SKIRTS

Dresses or skirts must be worn at or below the knee.

HAIRTYLES To a book hours

For health and safety reasons hair must be tied back and 'off the face'. This means that for both male and female students hair is off the collar. Plaits, pony tails, braids and buns are permitted but pieces of hair hanging or over the face, half up or loose ponytails are not permitted. Hair must be natural in colour and style and kept clean.

Unusual hairstyles, as determined by the College, are unacceptable (e.g. dreadlocks, shaved heads less than a 'number 2', fringes hanging over eyes and mohawks).

BOYS MUST BE CLEAN SHAVEN

Students who are unable to shave for dermatological reasons must provide an up-to-date Dermatologist Medical Certificate in order to apply for an exemption; exemptions will be granted for a maximum of 2 weeks. Students exempt from shaving will be expected to keep their facial hair trimmed as closely as possible during this time. Distinct or noticeable facial hair such moustaches, beards, goaties and sideburns are not permitted.

JEWELLERY AND MAKE-UP

Students are not permitted to wear visible make-up (including false eyelashes or eyelash extensions) or jewellery except for a watch, and plain sleepers or studs for pierced ears. Only one sleeper or stud per ear. Sleepers or studs should be either silver or gold in colour. Any other visible piercings of any form are not permitted. Clear plastic plugs or band-aid coverings are not acceptable.

A small crucifix or religious emblem on a necklace is acceptable. However, they are best worn beneath the student's shirt or dress. Nail polish, gel nails and/or acrylic nails are not permitted.

RUNNERS/SPORTS SHOES

The only time runners or gym shoes are to be worn to school is with the sports uniform. At all other times, black leather shoes are to be worn. Should shoes need to be replaced, then that is to be done immediately, regardless of the time of year (including Term 4).

Please note: The soles of runners are to be non-marking. Dunlop Volleys, Vans, Converse, canvas shoes and/or sandshoes are not permitted.

SCHOOL SHOES - BLACK LEATHER

For OHS purposes the school shoe must be lace up. Black leather runners/sports shoes will not be accepted with the full school uniform.

SHIRT

In Term 1 and after the Melbourne Cup long weekend, the shirt with the monogram and firm collar does not have to be tucked in. All other Term times, a white long sleeve shirt (with or without the monogram) must be worn with a firm collar (e.g. top button done), with the school tie and tucked into the school pants.

SOCKS

Students may wear plain white or the College ankle socks with their HPE uniform. For male students, the grey College socks must be worn with the regular school uniform (both Summer and Winter) and girls are to wear either the College ankle socks or plain white socks with their regular school uniform (both Summer and Winter).

White socks with branding, socks which are not visible or are any other colour than those stipulated (e.g. grey or white) are not permitted.

SPORTS UNIFORM

The full Sports Uniform may be worn to school if Sport/HPE is timetabled for that day. It is recommended that families purchase at least two House polo tops.

SPRAY JACKET

Spray jackets can be worn to and from school over the blazer only in wet weather. The spray jacket cannot replace the blazer or sport jacket as the outermost garment.

SUNSMART

In Terms 1 and 4, the College Cap is to be worn while outdoors on sports fields. The cap is to be worn for PE, sport sessions, SACCSS events and training and other activities at recess and lunchtime.

COLLEGE TIE

In Term 1 and after the Melbourne Cup long weekend, the tie does not have to be worn as part of the Summer Uniform. When worn with the Winter Uniform the tie must be tightened to fit correctly around the neck (top button fastened). Whenever the tie is worn, the shirt must be tucked in.

NOTE

No garments other than those stated on the uniform list are to be visible. This includes coloured T-Shirts or singlets which are visible through shirts, boxer shorts under dresses/above trousers, and socks beneath or over tights. Skivvies are not part of the uniform.

If you are not wearing the correct uniform

ALL STAFF check uniform every day. If you are not wearing the correct uniform and have a legitimate reason, then you must provide a note from your parent/guardian and give it to your Pastoral Care teacher. A note will be written on SEQTA stating the length of time for which the exemption has been granted. A record of the exemptions will be kept and the Year Level Leader informed of any concerns or repeat offences. If you do not have a note, then your Year Level Leader will follow this up with your parents/guardians.

Students may be issued with consequences for breaches of the Uniform Policy at the discretion of the Year Level Leader, Directors of Students and/ or Leadership Team. Please note that whenever students are in uniform they must wear it fully, neatly and correctly; as such, students may be issued with consequences for uniform breaches that occur off campus and/or outside of school hours.

APPROVED UNIFORM ITEMS



SUMMER UNIFORM

(TERMS ONE AND FOUR)**

** Formal Winter Uniform can also be worn during these Terms

The Summer dress is to be worn at or below the knee.

The monogrammed Summer shirt is to be worn with the tailored shorts and does not need to be tucked in.



Grey College socks must be worn with the regular school uniform.

Black leather lace up shoes must be worn.



WINTER UNIFORM

Black leather lace up

shoes must be worn.

(TERMS TWO AND THREE)

Blazers and ties are compulsory to and from school and at all formal occasions.

The jumper is not to be worn as the outermost garment.

The tie must be tightened to fit correctly around the neck (top button fastened). Whenever the tie is worn, the shirt must be tucked in.





SPORTS UNIFORM

The full Sports Uniform may be worn to school if Sport/HPE is timetabled for that day.

The only time runners or gym shoes are to be worn to school is with the Sports Uniform.

Students may wear plain white or the College ankle socks with their Sport/HPE uniform.

White socks with branding, socks which are not visible or are any other colour other than those stipulated (eg. grey or white) are not permitted.



COLLEGE BAGS

All students must have an approved College bag.



COLLEGE CAP

Caps are compulsory for all PE activities in Terms 1 and 4.

CAPS are not to be worn inside.

OPTIONAL UNIFORM ITEMS



The **RUGBY TOP** can be worn with the College Sports Uniform, which MUST include the House Polo Top.

The **SPRAY JACKET** can be worn to and from school over the blazer in wet weather only.





BEANIES and **SCARVES** can be worn in Winter months only.

These items can only be worn to and from school and in the grounds during the day.
